It is with great sadness that we note the sudden death of Rosemary McKenzie on 28 October 2023. A few knew of her recent health challenges, however, they seemed to be under control. Thus, her passing came as a huge surprise to all who knew her. At the time of her demise, she was President of Family History ACT (FHACT or HAGSOC) and President of the Australasian Federation of Family History Organisations (AFFHO).

Rosemary was a member of our Management Committee for a few years up to 2014. She also managed our website during that time.

Her contribution to FHACT was tremendous. In addition to the role of President she was, at the time of her passing, editor of the Ancestral Searcher (from 2016), and volunteers coordinator. Previously, she was also Councillor, Treasurer (for a couple of years

concurrently with being President) and Vice-President. She also did the preparation for publishing of a number of FHACT publications including the series *Every Family has a Story*, the collections of short-listed entries from the EM Fletcher writing competition.

Rosemary was elected President of AFFHO earlier this year after being on the committee for a couple of years. She was making a great contribution to the running of AFFHO.

In the broader genealogical community, she was a member of the committee of the Clan McKenzie Society in Australia and edited their journal.

Rosemary will be sorely missed by the genealogy community in Australia and more broadly.
